
## About Peter Moore

#### Tournament Information

#### FORMAT:

Individual Stroke Play ~54 Holes (no cut)

#### HANDICAPS:

Handicaps as of Monday, June 2nd will be used for the competition.

Please note: A CONTESTANT who is not a member of the USGA "GHIN" handicap system must confirm the name of the Organization issuing the valid handicap as well as the player's number issued by that Organization. A player with an unverified handicap will not be eligible for net payouts.

#### **DIVISIONS:**

Championship - Ages 34 & younger

Junior - Senior - Ages 35 - 53

Senior - Ages 54 & older

#### TEES:

All players will play from the same set of tees at an approximate total yardage of 6,600 yards.

#### TIES:

In the event of a tie for the Overall Champion, a sudden-death play-off will begin on hole #1. A rotation of hole #1 and hole #9 will be played.

- USGA Rules govern all play except where modified by local rules.
- The Designated Practice Areas on the course include the driving range and practice putting greens.
- Out of Bounds is defined by the inside edges of white stakes and or boundary fences.
- Penalty Areas are defined by Red or Yellow stakes or lines
- Drop Zones: Holes #4, #5, #7 & #12:
   Drop zones are marked with a white circle and are provided as an additional relief option.

Holes #4 & #7:

In order to use the drop zone located behind these two greens, the ball must have crossed the edge between the two green stakes on the green side of the penalty area. During the play of #13, the yellow penalty area on #5 will be played as a red penalty area.



- Abnormal Course Conditions
   (Immovable obstructions): Rule 16.1
   included but not limited to:
- -Ground Under Repair: Identified by a white line around the abnormal ground condition

Artificially surfaced roads and their extensions.

All outhouses, buildings and dwellings Landscaped Areas: "Flowerbeds and decorative planting areas are NOT abnormal course conditions and the ball MUST be played as it lies. Exception: Landscaped areas marked with blue stakes are No Play Zones (free relief must be taken under rule 16.1b)

Sprinkler Heads: When sprinkler heads are within 2 club lengths of the green and your ball is within 2 club lengths of the sprinkler head and on your intended line, the USGA recommends a local rule of free relief (relief would be dropping the ball within 1 club length of obstruction-no nearer the hole).

 Replacement of a broken or significantly damaged club: Model Local Rule G-9 is in effect.



 USGA approved distance measuring devices that provide yardages are allowed.
 Features on the device that allow for elevation, wind, or any measurement other than raw yardage shall be disabled.

## - Interference from the Protective Fence Over the Driving Range Tee:

During play of the 14th and 15th holes, the player may use the appropriate drop zone (DZ1 for #14 and DZ2 for #15), if there exists physical or line of play interference from the from the fence around the driving range. Relief is allowed (per model local rule E-6) if the player has physical or line of play interference and the players ball lies between the protective fence and the line forward of the drop zone. The player may take relief by dropping a ball in and playing it from within the drop zone, but this relief is only allowed if the ball is closer to the hole than the drop zone. Immovable obstruction relief is also available to the player if they have interference from the protective fence under 16.1b.



If the player's ball lies in the general area and there is interference by an immovable obstruction the player may take free relief by dropping the original ball or another ball in and playing it from this relief area:

- Reference Point: The nearest point of complete relief where both physical and line of sight interference no longer exists
- Size of Relief Area from Reference Point:
   The entire area within one club length from the reference point, but with these limits;
- Limits on Location of Relief Area:
- Must be in the general area.
- Must not be nearer the hole than the reference point, and
- There must be complete relief from both physical and line of sight interference by the obstruction.
- PACE OF PLAY: Players shall play in a prompt pace without undue delay. You must keep pace with the group in front of you. Warnings will be given to any groups hat are out of position, each individual will be timed and anyone taking over 40 seconds to play a shot will be warned. (1st offense will be a warning, 2nd offense 1 shot penalty, and the 3rd offense 2 shot penalty). After the 3rd offense the next infraction within the same round will be disqualification.



- CODE OF CONDUCT: All players shall play in the spirit of the game by showing respect to other players and the golf course. A player will be penalized either 1 shot or the general penalty based on the infraction and disqualified for an act of serious misconduct as determined by the committee. The use of cell phones is prohibited (except for the use of the EZ-locator app). THE PLAYING OF MUSIC IS PROHIBITED REGARDLESS OF VOLUME.
- CADDIES: Caddies will be permitted.
   Caddies will be required to wear a caddy bib supplied by the starter for the duration of the round.
- **SPECTATORS:** Spectators will be permitted. However, spectators will be strongly encouraged to remain a respectable distance away from players on the course. Spectator carts will be approved on a case by case basis (carts to remain on path for the round).
- PUSH CARTS: Not permitted on tees or between bunkers and the green.



- **DIVOTS:** Please fill with the turf divot before reaching for the sand and seed bottle.
- BUNKER RAKES: Place rakes inside bunkers with handle facing out.
- SCORECARDS: A player's scorecard has been returned when submitted to the scoring area (1945 Room in the clubhouse). Scorecards to be returned immediately following play.
- TIES: In case of a tie for the overall champion a sudden-death playoff will be held to determine the winner. The play-off will begin immediately after the last scorecard is returned. A two-hole rotation of #1 and #9 will be used.


