## Local Rules \& Information

$\checkmark$ USGA Rules govern all play except where modified by local rules.
$\checkmark \quad$ The Designated Practice Areas on the course include the driving range and practice putting greens
$\checkmark$ Out of Bounds is defined by the inside edges of white stakes and or boundary fences
$\checkmark \quad$ Penalty Areas are defined by Red or Yellow stakes or lines
-Drop Zones: Holes \#4, \#5, \#7 \& \#12: Drop zones are marked with a white circle and are provided as an additional relief option. Holes \#4 \& \#7-In order to use the drop zone located behind these two greens, the ball must have crossed the edge between the two green stakes on the green side of the penalty area.
During the play of \#13, the yellow penalty area on \#5 will be played as a red penalty area.

$\checkmark$ Abnormal Course Conditions (Immovable obstructions); Rule 16.1 included but not limited to:
-Ground Under Repair: Identified by a white line around the abnormal ground condition.
-Artificially surfaced roads and their extensions
-All outhouses, buildings and dwellings -Landscaped Areas: "Flowerbeds and decorative planting areas are NOT abnormal course conditions and the ball MUST be played as it lies. Exception: Landscaped areas marked with blue stakes are No Play Zones (free relief must be taken under rule 16.1b)
-Sprinkler Heads: When sprinkler heads are within 2 club lengths of the green and your ball is within 2 club lengths of the sprinkler head and on your intended line, the USGA recommends a local rule of free relief (relief would be dropping the ball within 1 club length of obstruction-no nearer the hole)
$\checkmark \quad$ Replacement of a broken or significantly damaged club: Model Local Rule G-9 is in effect

$\checkmark$ USGA approved distance measuring devices that provide yardages are allowed. Features on the device that allow for elevation, wind, or any measurement other than raw yardage shall be disabled.
$\checkmark$ TEMPORARY IMMOVABLE OBSTRUCTION: The lower range cover, safety net, and protective screen (located between the 14th \& 15th holes) will be treated as a temporary immovable obstruction. Interference by an immovable obstruction occurs when (a) the ball lies in front of and so close to the immovable obstruction so that the obstruction interferes with the player's stance or the area of his intended swing, or (b) for this obstruction only, the ball lies in, on, under or behind the obstruction so that any part of the obstruction intervenes directly between the player's ball and the hole and is on his line of play, interference also exists if the ball lies within one clublength of a spot equidistant from the hole where such intervention would exist
(Model Local Rule F-23)
Relief for interference for ball in or on lower range cover located between the $14^{\text {th }}$ and $15^{\text {th }}$ holes


If the player's ball lies in the general area and there is interference by an immovable obstruction the player may take free relief by dropping the original ball or another ball in and playing it from this relief area:

- Reference Point: The nearest point of complete relief where both physical and line of sight interference no longer exists
- Size of Relief Area from Reference Point: The entire area within one club length from the reference point, but with these limits;
- Limits on Location of Relief Area:
> Must be in the general area.
> Must not be nearer the hole than the reference point, and
> There must be complete relief from both physical and line of sight interference by the obstruction.

$\checkmark$ PACE OF PLAY: Players shall play in a prompt pace without undue delay. You must keep pace with the group in front of you. Warnings will be given to any groups that are out of position, each individual will be timed and anyone taking over 40 seconds to play a shot will be warned. ( $1^{\text {st }}$ offense will be a warning, $2^{\text {nd }}$ offense 1 shot penalty and the $3^{\text {rd }}$ offense 2 shot penalty). After the $3^{\text {rd }}$ offense the next infraction within the same round will be disqualification.
$\checkmark$ CODE OF CONDUCT: All players shall play in the spirit of the game by showing respect to other players and the golf course. A player will be penalized either 1 shot or the general penalty based on the infraction and disqualified for an act of serious misconduct as determined by the committee. The use of cell phones is prohibited (except for the use of the EZ-locator app). THE PLAYING OF MUSIC IS PROHIBITED REGARDLESS OF VOLUME.

$\checkmark$ CADDIES: Caddies will be permitted. Caddies will be required to wear a caddy bib supplied by the starter for the duration of the round.
$\checkmark \quad$ SPECTATORS: Spectators will be permitted. However, spectators will be strongly encouraged to remain a respectable distance away from players on the course.
Spectator carts will be approved on a case by case basis (carts to remain on path for the round).
$\checkmark$ PUSH CARTS: Not permitted on tees or between bunkers and the green.
$\checkmark \quad$ DIVOTS: Please fill with the turf divot before reaching for the sand and seed bottle.
$\checkmark$ BUNKER RAKES: Place rakes inside bunkers with handle facing out.
$\checkmark$ SCORECARDS: A player's scorecard has been returned when submitted to the scoring area. (1945 room in the clubhouse). Scorecards to be returned immediately following play.

$\checkmark \quad$ TIES: In case of a tie for the overall champion a sudden-death playoff will be held to determine the winner. The play-off will begin immediately after the last scorecard is returned. A twohole rotation of \#1 and \#9 will be used.
$\checkmark$ WHEN RESULTS OF COMPETITION ARE FINAL: The Competition is final when all scores have been approved by the Committee and the championship trophy has been presented to the champion.
